Unfortunately Covid intervened and on both sides of the Channel uncertainty has prevailed for month after month. Since Saturday 18 October some 20 million French people in nine large cities spent their first evening under 9pm to 6am curfew. That affects a third of the country's population. People in these areas will need a certificate for permitted activities, such as travel to or from work, for medical attention, to visit a dependent relative or to walk a dog. In La Ferté Macé, being rural, it's better: Twinning members can meet to walk, attend films and eat together.

We are, obviously, looking forward to seeing everyone again.
